Mr. Carmack was born in New York City and moved to Georgia in 1985.

From 1965-1969, Mr. Carmack served as a Non-Commissioned Officer in the United States Air Force and he attended the United States Army Drill Sergeant's Academy from 1970-1971.

He attended Pace University majoring in Business Management and graduated from the National Center of Paralegal Training as well. Continuing education and additional training includes Executive Certifications in Negotiations from the University of Notre Dame and completed certifications in Project Management from George Washington University. He is also a Certified Settlement Consultant for Mediation and Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) and holds a Mastery Certification in Corporate Senior Management Leadership, as well as credentials as a Personal Profile System Dimensions of Behavior Facilitator.

He served as supervisor for the Criminal Division at the DeKalb County Superior Court, a Clerk of the Probate Court for Dekalb County and served 2 years as a Paralegal/Investigator assigned to the White Collar Crime Unit, in the District Attorney's Office and 4 years as a Paralegal/Investigator in the Juvenile Court of Dekalb County, for the DeKalb County District Attorney's Office, before his retirement in October, 2010.

Mr. Carmack is also actively involved with a host of community service groups and for the past seven years, Mr. Carmack has volunteered for the DeKalb County Juvenile Court "Rebound Program".
